FROM OUR POLICE: OFFICIAL PENNSYLVANIA FIRE POLICE SAFETY REGULATIONS

For the Public:

- *Be aware that fire police are sworn officers of a local government municipality.
- *All persons must obey a fire police officer's instructions or indications relating to traffic flow.
- *All drivers must obey traffic-control devices used to indicate hazardous conditions.
- *All drivers must stop and not proceed past, around or through a sign or traffic-control device used to close a road or highway due to an existing or potentially hazardous condition, unless directed to do so by an emergency service responder.

Pennsylvania Law (Title 75) provides for fines, restitution for fire, police, emergency medical services and emergency preparedness for persons violating fire police officer's directions or failing to obey traffic-control devices which warn of hazardous conditions.

NATIONAL CRAYON RECYCLE PROGRAM

Thanks to schools, organization educators and kids across the county, this "recycling" education, community service has made it possible to stop more than 96,000 pounds of unwanted crayons from going into landfills.

The Crayon Recycle Program and Crazy Crayons, LLC, work together to take unwanted, rejected, and broken crayons and recycle them into new crayons. You don't have to do anything to the crayons except collect, box, and ship them.

CREDIT CARD PAYMENTS

You can pay your property taxes and/or water bill without leaving your home using our online payment service. We accept MasterCard, Visa, or Discover credit cards. A convenience fee of 2.45% (\$1.50 minimum) will be charged for online payments.

ELECTRONIC CHECK PAYMENTS

We also accept electronic check payments. Payments will be charged to your checking account at your bank. You will need your 9-digit routing number and your account number from your personal checks. A convenience fee of \$1.50 will be charged for processing the check.

When payment options appear, click on the "switch to pay with check" link. When paying online, please use your account number as your reference number.

POLICE NEWS

It's time again to have your vehicle looked over by your service station for the up and coming cold weather months. Your tires should be checked to make sure they will get you through the winter safely. The car windshield wipers should be checked and if needed replaced for good visibility and the removal of snow and ice that can build up on the windshield. All windows on a vehicle must be cleared of all snow and ice. Remember driving on wet leaves can have the same effect as driving on snow and ice. Give yourself room and time to slow down.

**SNOW AND ICE
REMOVAL**

Ordinance Chapter 21 Section 202 states: All sidewalks shall be clear of ice and snow to a path at least 24" wide within 24 hours after the snow or ice has ceased to fall.

Chapter 15 Section 806 states: No person shall place, throw or otherwise dispose of snow or slush upon the travel lanes of any Borough Street.
